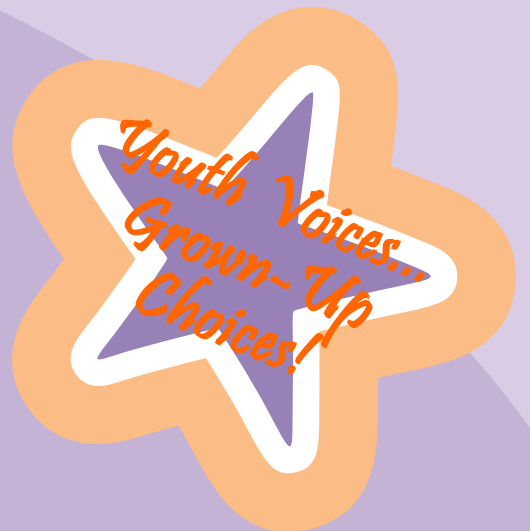

National SAVE Day

**WHEREAS**, nearly all young people across the nation are affected by violence; and

**WHEREAS**, its impact has devastated schools and communities and has brainwashed our youth into believing that violence is right; and

**WHEREAS**, violence is a behavior that we choose to learn, and we can choose to unlearn it; and

**WHEREAS**, students must take and be offered the opportunity for undertaking proactive roles in schools and communities to prevent violence; and

**WHEREAS**, Students Against Violence Everywhere (SAVE) was established by students after the death of a fellow classmate; and

**WHEREAS**, SAVE is a student-initiated and student-led program that educates youth in three essential elements, which are crime prevention, conflict management and serving others in meaningful projects; and

**WHEREAS**, SAVE chapters provide awareness opportunities to the entire school and community about the consequences of violence and is a long-range, proactive and preventative strategy that is open to all students; and

**WHEREAS**, the time has come for students to make a choice; and

**WHEREAS**, they must choose the type of individual they wish to become, students who indulge in violence or "Students Against Violence Everywhere"; and

**WHEREAS**, school administrators, educators, law enforcement, parents, and mostly students believe SAVE is a major factor in reducing violence on and around campus and SAVE activities have enabled youth to live by the SAVE slogan of "Youth Voices ... Grown-up Choices!"

## ★ **STUDENTS**

- Ensure Students are key players in violence prevention efforts.
- Hear student voices and concerns.
- Have a student seat on the safe schools committee.

## ★ **STAFF**

- Ask principal to officially proclaim National SAVE Day.
- Recognize staff members who have contributed to safe school efforts.
- Involve staff members in SAVE day planning and activities.

## ★ **SERVICE**

- Initiate a violence prevention service project(s).
- Have SAVE members do peer teaching/mentoring.

## ★ **AWARENESS**

- Announce school violence statistics on intercom
- Create awareness posters with National SAVE Day activities.
- Invite the media to your National SAVE day activities & send press releases after the event with pictures.

## ★ **ACTIVITIES**

- Sponsor a violence prevention Poster Contest or a sidewalk mural event.
- Raise awareness by placing purple ribbons on all lockers except the fourth locker where you place an orange ribbon. This represents the statistic that one in every four students will be affected by violence this year.

## ★ **ACADEMICS**

- Emphasize that programs such as SAVE are effective in preventing violence as well as assisting in creating safe and secure learning environments.





## ★ **VIOLENCE PREVENTION**

- Focus on crime prevention and conflict management strategies.
- Conduct classroom or school wide violence prevention activities.
- Kick-off a Fight Free Days initiative to aid in managing conflicts. Set up a reward system to acknowledge success.

## ★ **VOICES**

- Conduct a violence prevention essay contest.
- Sponsor a Decorate a Door contest for homeroom classes.
- Create a public service announcement to play on in-house channel or distribute to local radio and television stations.

## ★ **VOLUNTEERS**

- Ask local emergency agencies to provide information stations.
- Invite parents, PTA, civic organizations, and faith-based agencies to help plan and conduct successful National SAVE Day activities.

## ★ **ENGAGES**

- SAVE engages students in meaningful violence prevention efforts within their school and community.

## ★ **EMPOWERS**

- SAVE empowers youth with knowledge and skills necessary to provide service to their community and school.

## ★ **ENCOURAGES**

- SAVE encourages positive peer influences within the school and community through violence prevention efforts.

## ★ **EDUCATES**

- SAVE educates students about the effects and consequences of violence as well as safe activities for students, parents and the community.

# National SAVE Day Planning... Let's Get Started!

## Early September:

- Conduct a chapter officers meeting
- \* Meet to plan National SAVE Day. Things to consider:
  - \* potential activities
  - \* resources needed - funds, items, food, etc.
  - \* guest speakers
- \* Assign items to be researched/explored
  - \* activity costs
  - \* speaker costs
  - \* fundraising opportunities
  - \* community sponsors

## Mid September

- \* Present National SAVE Day ideas, needs and opportunities to Chapter members
- \* Develop a timeline and action plan
- \* Create committees and assign tasks
- \* Order promotional items needed for National SAVE Day (i.e. t-shirts, pens, ribbons, wristbands, etc.)
- \* From this meeting forward conduct weekly meetings for committee updates and further action assignments

## Early October

- \* Publicize upcoming National SAVE Day to student body, teachers, parents and the community. Suggestions: media release, Public Service Announcements (PSAs), posters, school newsletter, school website, email, and letters to parents
- \* Continue weekly meetings
- \* If appropriate confirm guest speaker and obtain speaker needs
- \* Practice, practice, practice any skits or speaking events that will occur
- \* Confirm sponsors and affirm if items will be picked up, delivered, etc.
- \* Seek additional volunteers if needed for a successful National SAVE day

## Week of National SAVE Day

- \* Monday
  - \* distribute Media Advisory to local papers, radios, TV stations
  - \* conduct PSA on in school announcements or TV programs, distribute to radio and TV stations
  - \* hold Chapter meeting to finalize everything for Wednesday
- \* Tuesday
  - \* decorate for National SAVE Day
  - \* tie up any loose ends
  - \* call media and invite them to attend the next days' activities
- \* Wednesday
  - \* conduct National SAVE Day activities!
  - \* be sure to recognize sponsors and supporters at events via signage and verbally

## After National SAVE Day

- \* send thank yous to:
  - \* media that attended
  - \* speakers
  - \* sponsors
  - \* volunteers
  - \* administrators and staff
- \* send pictures and a write up to National SAVE to be highlighted on the SAVE website!

# Violence Prevention... Get Involved!

## Students

- ★ Talk it Out! Settle arguments with words, not fists or weapons. Learn how to manage your anger effectively. Find ways to settle arguments by talking it out, working it out, or walking away rather than fighting.
- ★ Report rumors, threats, crimes or suspicious activities to teachers, principals, School Resource Officers or other adults.
- ★ Learn safe routes for traveling to and from school, and know good places to seek help.
- ★ Don't use illegal substances, and stay away from places and people associated with them.
- ★ Refuse to bring a weapon to school, refuse to carry a weapon for someone else, and refuse to keep silent about those who carry weapons.
- ★ Establish a Students Against Violence Everywhere Chapter (SAVE) at your school or join an existing one.
- ★ Get involved in violence prevention activities - have poster contests against violence, hold violence and drug prevention rallies.
- ★ Ask for a role in decision making about school rules, the discipline code and policies that affect you. Be actively involved in any school or community task forces dealing with the issue of school violence. Speak up and let others know how you feel about the issue.
- ★ Work with administrators to set up a way to anonymously report suspicious activities or rumors.
- ★ Help others settle disputes peacefully. Start or join a peer mediation program in your school.
- ★ Get involved and get your friends involved in community service projects and mentoring projects with younger kids.

## Parents

- ★ Know where your kids are, what they are doing, and who they are with at all times.
- ★ Build a good relationship with your child through good communication. Encourage talk and be attentive. Show interest in school work. Talk about school each day.
- ★ Be familiar with school rules and regulations and support them. Discuss with your children what the school considers a weapon and what the rules are. In many states, parents can be held liable for their children's actions, including inappropriate use of firearms.
- ★ Communicate clearly on the violence issue. Explain that you don't accept and won't tolerate violent behavior. Teach children how to reduce their risk of being victims of crime.
- ★ Act as role models. Settle your own conflicts peaceably and manage anger without violence. Help your children learn nonviolent ways to handle frustration, anger, and conflict.
- ★ Take an active role in your children's schools. Talk regularly with teachers and staff. Become involved in school activities - PTA, field trips, after school programs, and helping out in class or lunchroom.
- ★ Set clear limits on behaviors in advance. Discuss punishments and rewards in advance. Disciplining with framework and consistency helps teach self-discipline, a skill your children can use for the rest of their lives.
- ★ Discourage name-calling, teasing and bullying. These behaviors often escalate into fist fights (or worse). Whether the teaser is violent or not, the victim may see violence as the only way to stop it.

**Violence Prevention Pledge**

- \* I will not support or participate in any physical or verbal violence against any person.
- \* I agree not to bring a gun or any weapon to school or to any school event.
- \* If I see a gun or other weapon on campus or at a school event, I will alert an adult about its existence.
- \* I will demonstrate respect for others and encourage others to be positive role models for their peers.
- \* I will tell my peers to seek adult assistance when conflict situations begin to get out of control.
- \* I will support the protection and consolation for victims of violence, drugs and weapons.
- \* I will work to make our school and community free from violence, drugs and weapons.
- \* I will oppose the glorification of violence in the media and our culture.
- \* I will be committed to resolving conflicts without violence.
- \* I will practice respect and love for the earth and all creatures.
- \* I pledge to support my peers in my community by examining my own actions and making every effort to practice safety in my own life.
