CHAPEL HILL, NC. (August 05, 2013) — Carleen Wray, executive director of the National Association of Students Against Violence Everywhere (SAVE), has announced that Anna Tsui, a senior at Chapel Hill High School, has been selected as one of six high school students from across the country to serve on the 2013-2014 National SAVE Youth Advisory Board (YAB). Members of the board are meeting in Charlotte, NC to participate in a National Youth Leadership Institute where they are trained as presenters and spokespersons for the national organization. At the Institute, Tsui was elected by her peers to serve as Co-President.

“SAVE has taught me a tremendous amount about myself and opened the door to many unique and amazing opportunities. SAVE has provided me with incredible knowledge and numerous fun memories.” stated Miss Tsui. In addition to SAVE, Tsui also spends time tutoring other students and volunteering with kids in local elementary schools and activity groups. This is the fourth year that Tsui has been involved with her local SAVE chapter, and her second with the National Youth Advisory Board. Tsui is hoping to have a great time in the Youth Advisory Board with the other members while achieving many goals for the success and advancement of SAVE. The Board will meet throughout the year to discuss youth violence issues and develop action plans for SAVE chapters across the nation.

Members of the YAB developed their leadership skills through participation in training sessions, discussions of best practices for school violence prevention and the practice of educational activities for sharing with other SAVE students. They created goals for the year as well as a proactive action plan to combat violence through the implementation of the three essential elements of SAVE: crime prevention, conflict management and service projects.

SAVE is a student-run, student-initiated public nonprofit violence prevention organization with over 2,000 chapters in 48 states and more than 230,000 members in elementary, middle, high schools, colleges and communities nationwide.
