

White Oak senior recognized nationally for volunteerism



JACKSONVILLE, Onslow County - A White Oak High School senior has been recognized nationally for her volunteerism.

Mamie Frank received the President's Volunteer Service Award in the Gold category, meaning she has performed more than 250 service hours within a 12-month period of time. She has volunteered her time with the Carolina Animal Protection Society and the Infant of Prague Thrift Store. She has also been a mentor to students at Hunters Creek Middle and Hunters Creek Elementary schools through Students Against Violence Everywhere (SAVE), a student run violence prevention organization at White Oak High School.

According to a press release from Suzie Ulbrich, Public Information Officer for Onslow County Schools, Frank was selected as one of 10 high school students from across the country to serve on the 2015-16 National SAVE Youth Advisory Board.

Frank has been a member of SAVE since 2012. She served as the secretary from 2013 to 2014 and as the vice president from 2014 to 2015. She is also a member of the school's marching band since 2012. She earned position of section captain then section leader. Additionally, she is a member of National Honor Society and has participated in WOHS musical productions.
